Dear all who are associated with Sunnydown,

Feedback is one way all organisations can seek to demonstrate improvement. I have been so heartened by the uptake of several opportunities recently that I want to draw attention to some here.

By way of reminder, parents will be surveyed at least once per year regarding their perceptions of Sunnydown School. These are offered to families immediately after respective parents' evenings. Year 9 families are being surveyed currently since their parents' evening was on Wednesday of this week and closes at 5pm tonight.

Regarding Year 9 parents' evening, thank you to the families able to be here in person. The face to face collaboration between my dedicated staff team and parents is invaluable, with the outcome of even better outcomes for our children. I encourage all families to make every effort to attend their respective parents' evenings.

A Surrey wide survey is mentioned further along this edition of the newsletter. I would encourage all families to try and find the time to respond to this as it will inform future SEND services across the county.

Finally, staff, students, governors and families have recently been invited to undertake a SWOT analysis. I will present some initial findings and feedback to governors on Monday evening. I cannot thank the families who shared their views enough. A brief summary of major trends is offered below.

Regarding the tables below, I offer no context nor explanation. This is deliberate so that respondents can feel reassured that their voices are being heard.

One family commented 'the commitment of the staff at Sunnydown which is fed down from the leadership team is shown in the students progress and attainment.'

Students shared that 'when I'm going through a hard time they help me,' 'teachers and TAs are nice and helpful,' 'the Friday curriculum ... Go Kart building project ... are great.'

One family commented that 'whilst we appreciate the communication from the school regards to day to day events, at times it feels parents/carers could do with more notice and more communication from the office as messages can get lost in translation through my son.'

Students felt comfortable in sharing the following observations (not an exhaustive list).

- Too much swearing from students
- No opportunities to socialise with girls
- Trips are mainly sport-focused
- Not enough animals
- Classrooms are plain/need updating
- Length of school day on Monday and Friday
- Packed lunch students sitting inside

As the leader of Sunnydown School, I will continue to explore ways to celebrate the strengths, rectify the weaknesses, take advantage of the opportunities and mitigate the risks. Thank you to all who have shared their views.
