Dear all who are associated with Sunnydown,

Sunnydown is a school that adheres to and promotes British Values which are the values are the principles and standards of behavior that define what it means to be a citizen in a modern and diverse Britain. These values include:

Democracy: A culture based on freedom and equality, where everyone is aware of their rights and responsibilities

Rule of law: The need for rules to make a safe, secure, and happy environment to live and work

Individual liberty: The freedom to be yourself and to have your own views

Mutual respect: Treating others with respect and courtesy, and listening to their views

Tolerance: Respecting and accepting the views and beliefs of others

Saturday 1st March sees the start of Ramadan. This year, to learn more about this particular religion, I will be fasting on weekdays. This will allow me to compare and contrast this religion with others, including Christianity.

During the month of Ramadan, Muslims won't eat or drink during the hours of daylight. This is called fasting. Children are not expected to fast until they reach puberty, usually around the age of 14.

Ramadan remembers the month the Qur'an (the Muslim holy book) was first revealed to the Prophet Muhammad. The actual night that the Qur'an was revealed is a night known as Lailut ul-Qadr ('The Night of Power').

Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar. The exact dates of Ramadan change every year. This is because Islam uses a calendar based on the cycles of the Moon.

In 2025 in the UK, Ramadan is expected to begin on Friday 28th February and will end on Sunday 30th March.

Most Muslims fast between dawn and sunset. Fasting allows Muslims to devote themselves to their faith. It is thought to teach self-discipline and reminds them of the suffering of the poor.

However, children, pregnant women, elderly people and those who are ill or travelling don't have to fast.

During Ramadan, it is common to have one meal (known as the suhoor), just before dawn and another (known as the iftar), directly after sunset.

Almost all Muslims try to give up bad habits during Ramadan. It is a time for prayer and good deeds. They will try to spend time with family and friends and help people in need.

Many Muslims will attempt to read the whole of the Qur'an at least once during Ramadan. They will also attend special services in Mosques during which the Qur'an is read.





Greenhouse Half Term Holiday Scheme




