Enhancing Our House Point System

We are excited to announce some important enhancements to our House Point system, designed to better support student progress and personal development. These changes have been informed by valuable student feedback and will take effect from the start of the summer term. The enhancements were approved by the Student Council and I thank them for their consideration and feedback to the proposal.

Why Are We Enhancing the System? At Sunnydown we recognise that every student is on a unique learning journey and therefore engaging with their own personal growth deserves rewarding. We are aligning House Points more closely with our RICE3 targets, ensuring that every student has equitable opportunities to earn recognition for their progress in resilience, independence, cooperation, engagement and effort.

What's Changing? Moving forward, House Points will be directly linked to students' progress in the RICE3 areas. This will enable staff to reward not just academic success but also the vital skills and qualities that contribute to well-rounded personal growth. Whether a student shows increased independence in their learning, demonstrates resilience in overcoming challenges, or collaborates effectively with peers, their efforts will be acknowledged and celebrated.

What Does This Mean for Students? By connecting House Points to RICE3 targets, we hope to accelerate student focus on developing key life skills while maintaining fairness in how points are awarded. Every student will have the opportunity to succeed, regardless of their starting point, as the system now recognises individual progress and effort across a broader range of achievements. We will also introduce RICE3 awards to the Friday whole school assemblies celebrating students' efforts and progress.

We believe these enhancements will make the House Point system even more meaningful, motivating students to strive for personal growth while contributing to their House's success.

We look forward to seeing the positive impact this will have on our school community and encourage parents and carers to discuss these changes with their children as we approach the summer term.

Morning Arrival

We are finding an increasing number of boys wanting to spend time in the corridors of Forest View in the mornings, between arriving at school and the start of the day at 9.00am (9.30am on Mondays).
